ERIN POPOVICH

Administrator, Classification & Emerging Sport Programming

Erin Popovich joined the United States Olympic Committee shortly after announcing her retirement from competitive swimming in 2010. The three-time Paralympian currently serves as the classification and emerging sports program administrator at the USOC.

Popovich won three gold medals and three silver medals while setting four world records at the 2000 Paralympic Games in Sydney. At the Athens Games in 2004, she earned seven gold medals in as many events, while setting three world records and four Paralympic Games records. In 2008, she added six medals to her collection – four golds and two silvers – and set world records in the 200-meter individual medley and 100 breaststroke.

She is a two-time ESPY Award winner for Best Female Athlete with a Disability (2005, 2009), and was also named the Women's Sports Foundation SportsWoman of the Year in 2005.

Popovich received a Bachelor of Science degree from Colorado State University in May 2007. She currently resides in Colorado Springs, Colo.
