RON BRANT

High Performance Director

Ron Brant was named high performance director at the United States Olympic Committee in October 2009, after serving as the men's national team coordinator for the 2009 World Gymnastics Championships in London. In his current role, Brant helps secure resources and guides the high performance initiatives for eight Olympic sport programs.

During his tenure with USA Gymnastics, Brant led the U.S. men to consecutive Olympic team medals in 2004 and 2008 – a program first. He also aided the U.S. men to seven world championships medals – including, three golds, two silvers and two bronzes – marking the team's best medal tally since 1979.

From 1990-2000, Brant served as head coach of the resident men's gymnastics team at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., where he developed three Olympians, 10 world team members and a world championships silver medalist. During that time, he was twice named USA Gymnastics coach of the year in 1997 and 1999. He also served as the president of the United States Elite Men's Gymnastics Association from 1991-93.

Brant earned his Bachelor of Science from the University of Illinois. Additionally, he attended the U.S. Army Leadership School, Kellogg School of Business and the Olympic Sport Leadership Certificate Program.
